

AFRICORR 2018 "Expanding Cortec's Footprint in Africa"





AFRICORR 2018 was held in Johannesburg, South Africa, on July 18th, coinciding with the 100th birthday of former President Nelson Mandela. The corrosion conference was organized by the Corrosion Institute of South Africa (CORRISA) in partnership for the first time with NACE International, NACE International's Director of Global Operations, Tommy Tam, being present.
